LATROBE VALLEY IGNORED IN STATE BUDGET

Russell Northe has condemned the Brumby Government for neglecting the Latrobe Valley in the 2010/11 State Budget.

Mr Northe said the budget failed to provide any new projects in the region, instead focusing on those already in progress, including the Traralgon – Sale highway duplication, the redevelopment of Latrobe Community Health Services facility in Morwell and the establishment of a GippsTAFE facility in Traralgon.

“The budget has provided very little for the Latrobe Valley community, especially in the healthcare and public transport portfolios,” Mr Northe said.

“Issues which I have continuously raised with the Brumby Government have not been recognised, such as the Latrobe Regional Hospital master plan, and the need for extra hospital beds. Representations made on these issues appear to have been in vain.

“Further to the issue of bed capacity at Latrobe Regional Hospital, it is also widely known that there is a distinct lack of supported accommodation for those with disabilities in Gippsland, and mental health

services and bed capacity are at stretching point. Unfortunately, this budget brings no joy to families dealing with these tough health issues.

“The issue of public transport has also been overlooked, with no reference to Gippsland. The Brumby Government has again excluded our region from any funding commitments under this proposal with regional areas such as Geelong, Bendigo and Ballarat referred to frequently, but no mention of Gippsland.

“It is also extremely disappointing that local community safety initiatives such as a NightRider Bus service continue to be ignored. Instead, the Brumby Government continues to put its focus on the public transport safety in metropolitan centres, and avoid what is required in the Latrobe Valley.

“The Latrobe Valley has missed out significantly in this years State Budget, which will leave our community thoroughly disappointed. The Brumby Government appears to have stopped listening to the needs of those who reside in the Gippsland region and this Budget is indicative of a Government that is completely out of touch.”
